



Computing in the Classroom and the First Lego League

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The group was formed to address the fact that graduates/school leavers with computer science skills are dropping, even as the demand for these skills is soaring.

We want to encourage kids, parents and schools to look on computing as something fun, exciting and full of potential.

The First Lego League (FLL) is an international competition with 265,000 kids participating in 80 countries.

Working with the FLL we focus on broadening participation and maximising impact.

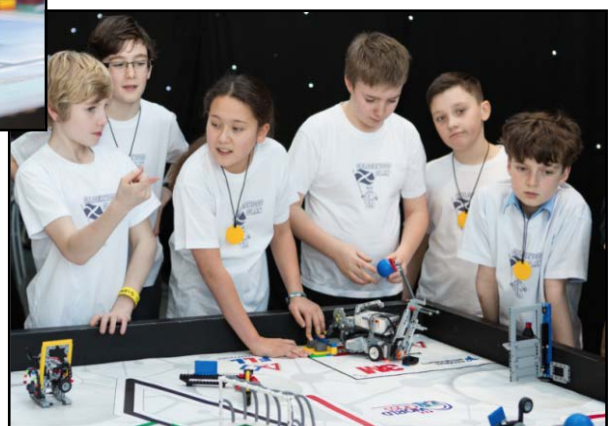
We provide bursaries for schools and work with teachers to link FLL with CfE.

In 2013, Lambda Jam launched FLL Scotland with 8 teams in 1 competition (Edinburgh)

In 2014, YAS joined in to take the competition national: 28 teams (250 kids) in 3 competitions (Edinburgh, Glasgow, Aberdeen)

In 2015, the competition grew to 500 kids in 5 competitions

In 2017, we again had 3 competitions
